STAGE 2 LEARNING OVERVIEW



TERM | WEEKS 2-5 2025



ENGLISH

Big Idea: Building a Community of Learners - students will spend the first 3 weeks of the term building a sense of reading for enjoyment.

Students will:

- Identify the purpose of texts (to entertain, to inform, to persuade) and use evidence to support their thinking.
- Discuss texts they are reading, identifying characters and plot and introducing the author and illustrator.
- Identify characteristics of an effective reader, writer and speller.
- Use correct page layout (including title and date) when writing in their writer's notebook and journal.
- Write a recount on an aspect of their holidays with a focus on text and sentence structure.



MATHEMATICS

Big Idea: Place Value - students will be able to recognise place value and be able to count, order, read and record numbers up to 5 digits.

Students will:

- Represent numbers up to 4 digits in words, numerals, objects and digital displays.
- Partition numbers into hundreds, tens and ones.
- Make numbers in standard and non-standard ways.
- Count forwards and backwards by tens and hundreds.
- Play a variety of games to practice counting skills.

- Make decisions on what the classroom should look like and feel like.
- Co-construct anchor charts (effective readers, writers and spellers chart).
- Add to the word wall words and new vocabulary to be used in writing.
- Collaborate and create charts that explain respect, pride and courage.
- Collaboratively construct whole class expectations and routines.
