Learning is everywhere!

Yesterday's Mini-Fete was a huge success! It prompted **Mrs Tainsh** and **Mrs Costantini** to write about it on our K-2 teachers' Blog. Here is an excerpt of what they wrote:

During Mini Fete we couldn't help but <u>notice the learning</u> that was happening all around us!

There were the more obvious examples of learning including *reading* signs and advertisements, *adding* and *subtracting* money and *keeping score* in the games.

The more subtle included

- using adjectives to describe and guess 'What was in the box?',
- deciding where the best place to set up the slip and slide was so that best slide could be achieved by using the greatest *incline* and
- having opportunities to purchase items from a real fete stall and negotiating decisions with stall holders.

We can **capitalise** on students excitement around Mini Fete and **continue** the learning by making links to real world experiences.

For example—here are some ways we can stimulate students thinking and recognise the learning in an everyday situation!


Last Friday, Mr Zereka took 4 students (and their parents) to the Powerhouse Museum.
