
Welcome to the last 2 weeks of term 3! The weeks have flown by this year - and the holidays are near.

Abit messy but totally worth it!









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







#### 3/4 NASA with Ms Marwazi


We receive and complete homework in a 3 week cycle. Last week we shared and presented out learning and artworks we completed at home about Claude Monet and his 'waterlillies.'













In literacy, Kindergarten have been learning to retell stories using drama. We read books such as 'Wombat Stew', 'Stone Soup' and 'We're going on a Bear Hunt'. Children retold the story using puppets, voice recorder, draw, talk and write, and drama. Children were able to make the wombat stew using material from our environment such as mud, insects, gumnuts and feathers. After reading the book Stone soup, children made vegetable soup using real ingredients such as carrots, onions, potatoes, parsley, salt, pepper, and vegetable stock cubes. We cooked and enjoyed eating the vegetable soup together.
